First of all, we should be very proud that THREE of our region's choruses will be competing in Houston at the October international convention. London, Fenton Lakes, and Spirit of Detroit will all be giving us a sample of their competition packages when we meet in Sarnia for the Fall Regional Weekend on September 16 and 17. Your RMT members must wait until then to learn what changes concerning competition, regional boundaries and regional governance will affect Region 2 specifically. We do know that while the announcements will be made in October, the actual changes will occur in the future.

Your RMT members will be visiting Region 2 chapters and attending chapter shows in the coming months. If you have questions, concerns, suggestions -- share them with the members of your regional management team.

The presentation will again be made at the Saturday night program with their choruses cheering them on for all their years of service to Sweet Adelines.

All of our honorees have been presidents, board and team members, music staff, active movers and shakers of their choruses and have learned a multitude of music and choreography since October of 1985. Congratulations to each for her dedication.

The Star Award was initiated in 1992 and about 329 pins have been presented to deserving members. It was the original brainchild of Nila Krantz, Tri City, and is recognized as a badge of honor throughout the International organization.

The RMT expanded the criteria for qualifying for the pin by allowing 25 years of nonconsecutive singing membership to count. Members must have 25 years accumulated membership by the day of the presentation and have at least five consecutive years back in Region 2. Proof of membership is on the part of the member, supported by a letter from the current president or team leader.

In 1984, International adopted a staggered anniversary date program that began to show up in 2009. The RMT Award criteria call for completion of 25 years by the date of the presentation at Fall Regional Weekend. Members reaching membership after September 17, 2011 will receive their pins in the fall of 2012.

The **Young Singers Foundation** of Sweet Adelines International, was established in 1992 to enrich the lives of young people through educational programs in vocal music by awarding grants to school-based music programs; and funding to after-school and community vocal music activities for young people. The foundation also awards scholarships to students entering their sophomore year of college who are pursuing degrees in vocal music, music

education or music therapy. **The Young Women in Harmony Program** offers to music educators a means of including the study and performance of barbershop harmony in school music programs. The aim is to provide materials, training and performance opportunities for our youth and to foster appreciation for this American musical art form.

Chapters and our region play an important part in reaching music educators and their students through introducing our art form to them for our YWIH Program and our **Got Harmony Camp for boys and girls**. Sunrise Harmony, Tri City and Carillon Belles have been reaching out to our youth this year. We hope to hear more about other choruses taking an active part in this program.

We received help from the YSF Foundation again and RECEIVED a \$1,500 GRANT FOR OUR JUNE 25 Got Harmony Camp and Benefit Show in Davison.

Through pass-the-hat at our events, individual and chapter donations, chapter collections, business sponsors, the YSF Silent Auction at the international conventions, and the YWIH and the YSF sales tables at regional weekends, all have and will continue to donate to the Young Singers Foundation and to our YWIH Program in our region.

Once again talented youth gathered in Davison, Michigan as the Border Lakes Region 2 Sweet Adelines International held its fourth annual Got Harmony Day Camp and Benefit Show there. Talented young men and women from the ages of 8-25 attended the vocal music camp at the Davison Senior Center. They spent the day learning four-part-harmony, vocal production, choreography and stage presentation as well as meeting new friends and enjoying a day of singing and music. Some students came from as far away Toronto, Ontario, and Grand Rapids, Michigan. A group of 16 students came all the way from Hale, Michigan with their sponsor group, the Hale Sunshine Harmony Sweet Adelines Chorus. Seven of the students who came last year had such a good time they wanted to come again and bring some of their friends.

Song of the Lakes Sweet Adelines Chorus of Davison, Michigan and the men's Flint Arrowhead Chorus hosted the event. The faculty for the Got Harmony Day Camp included two outstanding quartets: The international award winning men's quartet from Kentucky/Texas, THE FRANCHISE, who worked with the boys and the 2010/2011 Region 2 Sweet Adelines champion quartet, OVERTURE, who acted as instructors for the girls.

Diane Catellane and Anne Kotchman co-directed the girls' Got Harmony Day Camp chorus at the camp and benefit show. Diane is a master director and is presently the director for the SHORELINE SOUND Sweet Adelines Chorus of Royal Oak, Michigan. Anne is the assistant director of SHORELINE SOUND and has been very active in working with the Young Women in Harmony Program, mentoring young women in the art of barbershop. Directing the young men's chorus was Jay Hawkins, who sings bass with THE FRANCHISE, also coaches young men's vocal groups.

The students filled out an evaluation at the end of the camp and all but just a few were extremely positive. Some of their comments include: *I liked this program so much that I would like to come again; The teaching was great!; You guys rock; I thought it was going to be awesome and it was; I loved the songs and the teachers. It was much more than I expected; I loved everything. I loved this place and it was the best.*



After spending the day rehearsing and fine-tuning (pun intended) the selected songs, the young men and women choral groups took to the stage at the Davison High School Auditorium for the Got Harmony Benefit Show.

The Got Harmony Camp choruses were joined on stage with an all-star cast of award winning quartets. After only one day to practice together, the Camp Choruses opened the show with a bang with outstanding performances. The SINGING ANGELS, 2010 Region 2 Sweet Adelines Four Star Harmony Champion Quartet, then took the stage and continued to wow the audience.

Tom Conner of Davison, Michigan performed with his award winning quartet, Men's Senior International Champion Quartet, RESISTING-A-REST, followed by DOUBLE DATE a mixed quartet, OVERTURE QUARTET, Region 2 Champions, and THE FRANCHISE, international award-winning quartet. Sylvia Karpinsky, master director of the Sweet Adelines Great Lakes Chorus from Sterling Heights, Michigan acted as emcee for the show. The combined camp choruses and all-star quartets closed the show to a standing ovation.
